## SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Entries for classes 1-9 MUST reach the Secretary not later than Wednesday, 9th September. Entries will be accepted up to Show Day for all other classes.
2. All Exhibitors must obey the order of the Steward. Refusal to do so will disqualify and make their exhibit liable for removal from the Showground.
3. Exhibitors are requested to put their names and addresses in a sealed envelope and attach to exhibit as items may need to be moved for judging.
4. All objections to be delivered in writing to the Secretary within one hour of the class being judged, with a deposit of £5 which shall be forfeited if the objection be considered frivolous. Stewards shall, where practicable, deal with objections.
5. Any breach of the Rules and Regulations of the Club, or Conditions of Entry, will render the Exhibitors liable to forfeit their prizes and be disqualified in such a manner and to such extent as the Sub-Committee appointed for the purpose may decide upon and the decision of the Sub-Committee, or any matter arising out of these Rules and Regulations, whether printed here or elsewhere in the Schedule, shall be final and binding.
6. Exhibits may not be removed from the tent before 5.00 pm. The tent will be unattended after 6.00 pm.
7. No prize to be awarded unless the judge considers there is sufficient merit.
8. All second prizes may be withdrawn unless three entries are received.
9. Each Exhibitor shall be solely responsible for and shall make good and repair any loss, damage, or injury caused or occasioned by or through his exhibit and shall indemnify and hold blameless the Usk Farmers' Club Limited against any legal or other proceedings in regard thereto.
10. The Club will not in any case hold themselves responsible for the loss of/or damage to any exhibit or his servant or any person attending the Show.
11. The Challenge Trophies will be presented at the Annual Dinner and must be returned to the Secretary by 1st September.
12. All exhibits must arrive at the Homecraft Tent and staged by 9.30 a.m. as the tent will be closed for judging by 10.00 a.m. prompt on the morning of the Show.
13. Entry Fees: 40p per class, Juniors 20p per class, except where stated. Stamps are not accepted. Cheques to be made payable to Usk Farmers' Club Ltd.
14. Exhibits to be brought to site, not sent to the Secretary.
15. The Show admission fee must be paid on entry to the showground and will be refunded if total class entry fees equal or exceed the cost of entering the showground, or at Secretary's discretion.

### BOILED FRUIT CAKE RECIPE

100g (4oz) margarine

100g (4oz) demerara sugar

225g (8oz) mixed fruit

150ml (½pt) hot water

1 egg

225g (8oz) S R flour

½ tsp nutmeg

1 tsp mixed spice

½ level tsp bicarbonate of soda

### METHOD

Put margarine, sugar, mixed fruit and water into a saucepan. Stir over low heat until melted. Bring to boil, simmer for 3 mins. Remove, cool, add rest of ingredients. Put into cake tin approx. 7", bake for about 1¼ hours at 325° F/170° C/Gas Mark 3.

## 20. CHERRY AND COCONUT CAKE

### RECIPE

6ozs. butter	5ozs. sugar
8ozs. plain flour	1tsp. baking powder
3 eggs	4ozs. glacé cherries
Approx. 2tbs. milk	Approx. 8in. cake tin
2ozs. coconut	

### METHOD

Cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat the eggs and add gradually. If the mixture curdles, add a little flour. Sieve the flour and baking powder. Add coconut. Halve the cherries and toss in the flour mixture. Fold in the flour. Add sufficient milk to a dropping consistency. Put into a greased and floured tin and bake in a slow oven 150° C/Gas Mark 2, 1-1½ hours until firm to touch.

### RECIPE

10ozs. plain flour	8ozs. butter
4 eggs	8ozs. light brown soft sugar
4ozs. sultanas	1oz. blanched almonds
4ozs. raisins	4ozs. currants
grated rind of 1 lemon	2ozs. candied peel
1tbs. milk	4ozs. glacé cherries
2ozs. split almonds	Round cake tin approx. 8in

### METHOD

Cream the butter and sugar together until soft and light. Gradually add the beaten eggs. Sieve the dry ingredients together. Mix the chopped almonds, cherries, fruit and peel together. Fold in the flour and enough milk to make a slow dropping consistency, then lastly add the fruit. Put into a prepared tin, arrange split almonds on top and brush with a little egg white. Bake in a moderate oven 160°/170°C Gas Mark 3 for 2½-3 hours until firm.

150ml (½pt) sunflower oil, plus extra for greasing	150g (5oz) light muscovado sugar
125g (4oz) wholemeal self-raising flour	60g (2oz) chopped walnuts
125g (4oz) white self-raising flour	125g (4oz) grated carrots
2tsp baking powder	1 ripe banana, mashed
1tsp ground cinnamon	2 eggs
Topping:	1 tbsp. milk
250g (8oz) low fat soft cheese	2 tsp clear honey
1 tsp lemon juice	chopped walnuts to decorate

Approx. 7" square cake tin

Oven temp: 180°C (350°F, gas 4). approx. 50 minutes.

### METHOD

Lightly oil tin and line base.

Combine all the cake ingredients – mix well, turn into tin and level.

Bake until risen and firm.

Cool cake in tin for a few minutes. Turn onto wire rack, remove paper and cool completely.

Mix together all topping ingredients, spread on top.

Finish with chopped walnuts over.
