# HORTICULTURAL SHOW RULES and REGULATIONS

- ALL ENTRIES must be made on the printed form to reach the SECRETARY or CHAIRMAN by not later than Wednesday 10th September, unless accepted by telephone at their discretion.
- 2. Exhibits to be staged by 9:30am.and NOT removed before 5:00pm on the day of the show. Exhibits may be staged on the evening prior to the Show date between the hours of 5.00-9.00pm at Exhibitor's own risk.
- 3. Exhibits must be grown by the Exhibitor. The Committee reserves the right to visit any Exhibitor's garden to inspect the crops.
- 4. Exhibitors will receive ENTRY cards at the SECRETARY'S table in the HORTICULTURAL tent.
- 5. Stewards will not be in attendance after 5:30 pm on show day
- 6. ALL PRIZE MONIES will be paid out on the day of the Show.
- 7. All Challenge Trophies must be returned to the Secretary by 31st August of the following year.
- 8. Exhibitors with 8 Entries or more, may be given a complimentary admission pass.
- 9. Highly Commended prize cards may be awarded at the Judges' discretion.
- 10. More than ONE Exhibit per Class per Exhibitor IS permitted.
- 11. Ideally all Exhibits should be correctly and clearly named.
- 12. The definition of a Novice is any person who has not previously won a prize in that class in the Horticultural Section.

# HONEY CAKE

### Ingredients

123.

Prize Money:

170g (6oz) Clear Honey

140g (5oz) Butter

85g (3oz) Light Muscovado Sugar

2 eggs - beaten

200g (7oz) Self Raising Flour

1 tbsp Water

# Icing

55g (2oz) Icing Sugar

1 tbls Clear Honey

1-2 tbsp Hot Water

### Method

Heat honey, butter and sugar with 1 tablespoon of water until melted

Remove from heat and mix in eggs and flour. Place in a 18cm/7" round, greased and lined cake tin and bake for 45 minutes 180°C/ 350°F fan oven, gas mark 4. Make the icing and trickle over the cake while still warm

#### FUDGE

#### Ingredients

450g (1lb) Sugar

60g (2oz) Butter

60g (2oz) Honey


150ml (1/4 Pint) Milk

#### Method

Prepare a greased tin approx. 18cm/7" square.

Put all the ingredients in a heavy based pan, and bring slowly to the boil, stirring all the time. Cover and boil for 2 minutes, Uncover and boil gently for approx. 15 minutes, and a soft boil stage has been reached( a little when dropped into cold water will form a soft boil (120°C/240°F).

Stand pan on a cold surface for 5 minutes, then beat mixture until it starts to thicken, then quickly pour into the tin. Mark into squares as it cools. Cut when cold
